
BOLTON ABBEY ESCAPES IN THE YORKSHIRE DALES


Bolton Abbey to Hare Head, Strid Wood and return



- From the village green, head north along the main road and under the road arches. The arches were once an aqueduct which carried water to the Priory Mill.
- After 90m, turn left up through a gate and follow the track up to the next gate.
- Continue with the fishponds on your left and go through a field leading up to a gate into the wood.

- Follow the signs through the wood.

- 5) On leaving the wood, the waymarked bridleway goes uphill over open fields and onto the moors.
- 6) After the third gate, take the footpath to the right, follow this down to the road and then to the right to meet the road close to the Strid Tea Rooms.
- 7) Cross the road and follow the track past the car park, taking the left fork down to the river, follow this upstream and cross at the aqueduct.

Tum right and follow the trail downstream for two miles before crossing the Cavendish Bridge.
